God has been incredibly faithful to us as CFaN. As we look back on what the Lord has done, we can only say THANK YOU JESUS.

In Joshua 4, the Lord instructed the nation of Israel to take up twelve stones from the middle of river Jordan as a memorial, after performing such a great miracle, confirming that he is in control. He then explained why this was important.

"6 to serve as a sign among you. In the future, when your children ask you, 'What do these stones mean?' 7 tell them that the flow of the Jordan was cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord. When it crossed the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. These stones are to be a memorial to the people of Israel forever." The twelve memorial stones in Joshua had significance in that,

- They were testament of God's goodness
- 2. They were testament of a 'Miracle working God'
- 3. They were testament of Gods protection
- 4. They were testament that God will always make a way
- 5. They were testament that His promises are yes and Amen

6. They serve as a basis of sharing our faith - Passed it to children (Look at what the Lord has done)

This was not the first time in the scriptures we see the stones serving as a reminder of His goodness. In 1 Samuel we see Samuel doing the same:

1 Samuel 7:12, then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen. He named it Ebenezer, saying, "Thus far the Lord has helped us."

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Indeed the Lord has helped us thus far. I am extremely thankful for our past, and acknowledge what the Lord has done being also cognisant of the fact that there is no future in the past. We therefore have to look at the past with a rear-view mirror and gaze to our future through the windshield. There is still more for us as a community, there are still more territories to be possessed. The story of CFaN is long from over. Celebrating the work of Christ: the Chief Builder at CFaN.

CFaN, we are kinder on the same boat - "building"

One is tempted to say God we are building, once the building is up with chairs, please fill them - I felt a rebuke from God - why should I (God) wait for the building to be completed in order to add? God wants to add now. CFaN, while you are busy with the physical building which He is involved in it, He wants to build the church (people) too, by adding. People with gifts already sharpened, like David with the skilled men who came to him:

1 Chronicles 12 v 23 - 38

These are the numbers of the men armed for battle who came to David at Hebron to turn Saul's kingdom over to him, as the Lord had said: from Judah, carrying shield and spear -6,800 armed for battle; from Simeon, warriors ready for battle—7,100; from Levi - 4,600, including Jehoiada, leader of the family of Aaron, with 3,700 men, and Zadok, a brave young warrior, with 22 officers from his family; from Benjamin, Saul's tribe -3,000, most of whom had remained loyal to Saul's house until then; from Ephraim, brave warriors, famous in their own clans - 20,800; from half the tribe of Manasseh, designated by name to come and make David king - 18,000; from Issachar, men who understood the times and knew what Israel should do - 200 chiefs, with all their relatives under their command; from Zebulun, experienced soldiers prepared for battle with every type of weapon, to help David with undivided loyalty - 50,000; from Naphtali -1,000 officers, together with 37,000 men carrying shields and spears; from Dan, ready for battle - 28,600; from Asher, experienced soldiers prepared for battle - 40,000; and from east of the Jordan, from Reuben,

Gad and the half-tribe of Manasseh, armed with every type of weapon -120,000. All these were fighting men who volunteered to serve in the ranks. They came to Hebron fully determined to make David king over all Israel. All the rest of the Israelites were also of one mind to make David king.

So go for it CFaN and let Jesus be involved in both buildings.

Remembering what God has done as we run towards Ine future

I must confess I'm not big on anniversaries and I suppose I'm so predisposed to looking ahead, to anticipate what God has in mind for our future rather than reminiscing about our past. Having said that I do think there is real value in remembering what God has done so we don't forget the blessings we have been recipients of over the years. The old song goes "Count your blessings, name them one by one and it will surprise you what the Lord has done". It's good to be surprised by the blessing of God.

Just over 20 years ago Mark and Rose were on our team in Hillcrest and God was stirring them to plant a local Church in Gaborone. I remember doing an exploration trip with Mark looking at the possibilities of the city. What amazed me then and still does was Mark's resourcefulness because within a few days, he was speaking to the police of the city and preaching to the crowds standing in line at the hospital. I love the fact that this Church is rooted in gospel preaching. This gospel root has now produced a Church reaching out to the city over multiple locations and the heart of your beginning is still very much alive in your present journey.

I love the prophetic and enjoy reading over prophetic words given to me or the Church at regular times through the year. God's word has no expiry date and often we look through the lens of our present situation, as we interpret or reflect on them. But I love that these spoken words continue through into our future – lining up, like lights, confirming direction ahead. The foundation of CFaN is built on both the Apostolic and the Prophetic – there are multiple words that speak into your future as a 'family'. It helps us to read the season we are in.

We, in the western world tend to think linear when it comes to time. We feel it can be lost or pass us by. This can have a negative effect on us and can be discouraging at times, especially if we feel we have missed a "moment" perhaps in raising our children, in relationships or missional opportunities etc. Surprisingly the Word doesn't seem to reference this – it's as if God speaks rather in seasons. Giving the impression that there is always a redemptive season ahead, a promise of something new, a second chance ahead to see a miracle happen even in the darkest of Winter, the promise of Spring calls us.

Ecclesiastes 3:1 "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:"

In the light of this I believe it's spring time for CFaN and that God is calling all of you into a season of producing new life. What looked like winter only a year ago suddenly springs to life and has all the potential of much fruit. Your most fruitful season is ahead not because you are special in some way (I do think you are very special) but because you have continued to sow in seasons where it seemed no fruit would ever come.

Isaiah 43:19 "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

May God be honoured as you celebrate 20 years of His amazing grace... *but there is more to come.*

I have three thoughts for you as a church going forward and they are around the three specific pillars we use as a church to remain healthy. Jesus is the foundation of all we do and out of our love and devotion to Him, we use community, preaching and worship as practical pillars to ensure the church is healthy and reflects the kingdom of heaven in all its love, truth and power.

So firstly around community.

I believe that CFaN is an incredibly unique community in that the DNA to be multi-generational runs deep. Young preachers learning from older preachers, men, women, it will take everyone. There is no space for insecurity

feeling threatened in the coming days for CFaN, the kingdom desire to see each gift thrive needs to run through every facet of the church. This will require humility, honesty and training.

Around worship & music, I believe that CFaN has a leadership role within the churches of Botswana to pioneer and then to equip for a new sound and heart of worship. Again, the humility and the multi-faceted future that God has for CFaN will ensure incredible relevance. I believe that songwriters in CFaN should not be attempting to write congregational worship songs but rather write what is truly on their hearts after times of meditation with the Lord and in His word. The 'New Sites' are a company forming a battalion and 'The Base' is one of the branches that facilitates the nurturing, development and training of saints into leaders and saints who are equipped. Some years ago before Simon became leader of CFaN God opened up and "Lo, I saw Simon at the top of a hill and he had a sniper rifle gun with a telescope lenses to see things far away".

Why Church?

Many of us ask this question at some point during our Christian walk. Why Church? Why do we do things the way we do? What is the value here? Where is the power and the miracles that the bible speaks of? Is God even in this?

Many of us ask this question at some point during our Christian walk. Why Church? Why do we do things the way we do? What is the value here? Where is the power and the miracles that the bible speaks of? Is God even in this?

In my 18 years of being in CFaN and 30 years of being a believer, I have seen many people grapple with this question and, it is important that we grapple – that we search the scriptures and seek the heart of God on this issue, because when we do, we find the truth that will help us make decisions that align us with God's will for our lives and ultimately bear good fruits. I'm sure you will agree with me that the biggest problem with the Church worldwide today is that it is often full of man's wisdom, man's preferences, man's craving for entertainment, things that "justify" man's desire to sin, pride, jealousy, politics,... and the list goes on. But really, we can't be surprised by all of this – the bible clearly warns us multiple times of the danger of this rife deception.

It is clear to me that in every one of us, sin is crouching at the door ready to corrupt that which is intended for good. And many times it wins. I have seen it in my own life, personally, and I have seen it in the "corporateness" of the Church.



So what are we, as individuals, to do with this reality? Honestly, it would be easier to leave it behind us and wash our hands of the mess and move on. Many have done that and chose to live their Christian lives in isolation because they are fed up with the duplicity and sin of others.



Yet, God, in His sovereignty, chose the Church as His expression of love to the world, His mouthpiece, the main feeding ground for believers, the place where He chooses to pour out His corporate anointing.

So, what should that look like and where do I fit in? Well, let's go back to the start of the church at the beginning of Acts and have a look...

Here we see that the believers were all gathered together in one place. They were united in prayer. They were positioned. They devoted themselves. They were focussed on Jesus – and look at what happened next – there was a mighty move of the Holy Spirit and the gospel spread like wildfire, despite persecution and here we are, 2 000 years later.

Let's look at the word "devoted". Devoted is an action word. It is a choice that takes courage, strength and willpower. We continuously choose to be devoted when people are irritating, when things are not going right, when I feel I can do a better job. Devotion means that I lead my heart to what Christ wants. I take myself out of the picture and put His purposes first. I don't worry about my own comfort. I choose to suck up the fact that there is no mother's room or no good coffee. Devotion causes me to get out of bed when I am tired to serve Him and His people, because I am not devoted to myself but to what Christ is doing.

- **1.** *I choose to* find grace for others, because of the Grace that God has extended to me.
- **2.** I choose to make allowances for other's faults and forgive those who offend me (Col 3:13)
- **3.** I choose not to speak behind other's backs or leave in a huff, but to put into practice Matthew 18 which gives specific instructions on how Jesus wants me to deal with offence, and by doing that, God can usher in peace and healing.

- **4.** I choose to allow love to cover a multitude of sins, just as Jesus has covered my sin.
- **5.** *I choose to* honour those who lead and give me spiritual guidance. To show them respect and wholehearted love because of their work and I choose to live peacefully with others (*1Thes 5:12*)

What were the early church members

devoted to? The apostles teaching – this is the preaching of the Word. A devoted person will ruminate on the Word. They will weigh it up and wrestle with it and look at how it affects them personally and what needs to change in their own life and pray for the Holy Spirit to transform them.

How many times though, do we listen to the preaching of the Word for someone else? Or how often do we daydream about something else when the truth is coming from the pulpit? Have you ever closed your ears to the Word and become critical because of the person that is delivering it?

That is not the response of a devoted person.

They devoted themselves to fellowship – this is deep, meaningful connection with others – people who did not necessarily grow up the same way I did, who don't have the same educational level, who value things differently and think differently to me. People who are not perfect but are trying to be more like Jesus and making mistakes. (Just like me!) Fellowship is intentional. It can't work if each person is waiting for someone else to reach out to them. The devoted person is proactive and finds ways to break down the barriers.

They devoted themselves to the breaking of bread – they shared meals in each other's homes. Their focus was not on what others think of their couches, bad cooking or the fact that they only have bread and water. Their focus was on Christ and His purposes.

When last did you prepare a meal and invite someone from church into your personal space?

They devoted themselves to prayer – uniting them in heart and mind. You see, God is pleased by unity of his children. Where there is unity, He commands a blessing.

The result of this **passionate devotion** was that the apostles performed miracles, signs and wonders. People's faith levels were high! The believers met together in one place and shared all they had. They worshipped daily and met in homes and others were drawn in.

I agree that what we experience today is a far cry from the picture we see in Acts, but it is certainly something to aim at. What if a few of us were hungry for Jesus and devoted to what Christ wanted to do through us? That passion is infectious and can spread like wildfire. The problem is most of us are waiting for someone else to make it happen. Jesus calls each of us, he equips us and He gives us a special task to do.

Too many of us want to bypass the devotion part (too much hard work) and the gathering together (too much other stuff distracting us), but we really want to see the miracles!

This Christian walk is hard – we easily get distracted, lose focus and get discouraged. But Jesus has given us the Church and each other because there, we find strength and encouragement. But I must remember that I also have a responsibility to encourage and strengthen my brothers and sisters. Heb 10:24 says

"Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works"

To motivate others, I need to be intentional. I cannot creatively motivate someone without understanding them first and I can't understand them without being in their face and getting to know them.



We have all heard this scripture -"And let us not neglect our meeting together as some people do, but encourage one another"

Too many of us think that meeting together is about receiving. We see the church as a "service provider". I often hear things like "Worship today was boring" or "The leaders are not doing enough"

But if I am together with my imperfect brothers and sisters and under a covering of a God ordained leadership, I am protected. God will use people, as iron sharpens iron, to bring transformation in me. Of course I will be challenged by others, of course it will be uncomfortable. My pride will cause me to be offended, but will I choose to disengage or will I choose to be humble and make the necessary adjustments?

Often, I cannot see my weak areas and I need my brothers to help me with my blind spots. At times I will be so weak and I need to be near the hot coals to keep hanging on to my faith.



The Church in action, operating as God intended it is powerful. I can choose today to criticise and point out all the problem areas, or I can choose to take the truth of the Word and every good gift that God has given me and put it into practice and thereby shine Jesus' light to a dying world.

CFaN is Ready?

Growth is desirable in every context; be it in relationships, us maturing and even the body of Christ growing in faith and understanding of the Word...

Growing in our giftings. Growth is in every way a good thing if it brings positive impact and valuable outcomes (2 Peter 3:18). Hence, we celebrate babies becoming teenagers and teenagers, becoming adults and adults, getting old and being associated with wisdom.

It has been 20 years since CFaN, Botswana was started by Pastors, Mark and Rose Pasimupindu. Most of us witnessed why the days of small beginnings should never be despised, **Zech 4:10** " For who has despised the day of small things?" as we know that

Job 8:7 states "Though your beginning was small, yet your latter end would increase abundantly".

This is what has been happening over the years in CFaN... growth and increase. Note that in most growth curves, there is a period of what seems like stunted growth but overall growth would still be happening. Nobody ever considers the period of temporary stunted growth but delight in overall growth.

Over the years, God has been investing in the life of CFaN as He continues to build on the apostolic foundations. These same apostolic foundations are serving as the base for key apostolic ministries in worship, teaching and church planting. Being apostolic is a definite call that comes with unwavering commitment to execute what God would have called you to do. In good and bad times, the apostolic call does not retreat. In Acts 21: 7-14 we find Paul the apostle being warned by a reputable prophet Agabus, after four girls that could prophesy had not warned him of anything. He was warned of arrest and the brethren discouraged him from going to Jerusalem (abort the apostolic) but he expressed how committed he was to fulfilling God's mandate over his life. Paul was ready to die for the name of the Lord. Nothing could stop

him. Nothing should stop CFaN too. Arrest means denial of freedom and paralysis/ interruption of progress. There is a reason why Paul was not afraid of being arrested..... he had been arrested, beaten and left for dead before. He had faith that God would deliver Him from anything. In fact, the arrests and beatings had only served to strengthen his determination to love and serve God. CFaN shares a similar history with Paul.

As CFaN turns 20 years, the church has had its periods of arrests, interruptions and even deviations, BUT that only served to establish the church stronger. CFaN is ready to serve in all seasons. Hold on to the vision and call. Do not forsake the mission because when God-given, it will be God-executable.

• I see a strong evangelistic, worship and teaching edge being fortified. Some areas may seem new and you may feel they are not your strengths and that is correct.... He gives you strength and equips you for missions and excellence.

• A new sense of strategy will be established where the CFaN leadership will work on establishing multiple strategic partnerships and mentoring. These partnerships will further strengthen the CFaN base and capacitate multi-cities church plants.

• In that season God will give CFaN a seat of honor among cities' elders. Your voice shall be sought and your counsel respected.

In conclusion, I found out that the number 20 is very appropriate for CFaN's season. Twenty symbolizes a cycle of completeness and refers to a complete successful waiting period usually associated with a trial and is followed by God's generous reward and manifestation of His love. Jacob waited 20 years to get his wives and wealth released from Laban.



From one meeting to five, in multiple locations!

The impact of the Covid-19 pandemic left church leaders asking questions about the future of CFaN, in light of the new laws that dictated we go into full lockdown as a way to mitigate against the spread of the deadly virus. Thankfully, this was short lived as we were granted the freedom to meet again, though in smaller numbers of no more than 50 congregants.

After the lifting of the full lockdown era we were able to leverage technology to do church during the lock down, then doubled down on connecting and shepherding the flock, by setting up 5 sites in different locations.

Through the establishment of the sites, we were able serve our local communities in tangible and visible ways. We are leveraging the evangelistic opportunity to also reach new people. The result, is better outreach and church growth among the unchurched.

This concept of one church meeting across multiple locations is not new at all. It began in Acts 2 with the church of Jerusalem meeting in many locations. The multiple locations concept is well adapted to changing cultural realities and leverages technological advances.

However, CFaN truly made the paradigm shift from a pre-Covid mono-site, to a missiondriven, community-centric church that affords congregants the privilege to love, serve and disciple each other in an intimate setting.

Here are some takeaways and observations from the CFaN multi-sites representations:

- i) Attendance: convenient and made easy for local communities
- ii) Connection: allowed us to navigate our way around the attendance restrictions and have more people connected to each other physically and to God in worship.
- iii) Engagement: more opportunities for members to serve and grow at the different sites.
- iv) Fellowship: we are assured of continued fellowship not just for our flock but the unchurched as well during the pandemic
- v) Opportunity: we are positioned to reach different parts of the city beyond the Covid-19 era





Here to stay!

Whatever one thinks of our sites, they seem likely to remain on the landscape of CFaN for the foreseeable future.

My hope and prayer for CFaN is that this new normal becomes not an end in itself, but an effective means of spreading the Gospel of Christ to our communities and country at large.

Consider it this way: the first church (see Acts 2) was birthed in Jerusalem on the Day of Pentecost.

The Word spread from Jerusalem to Judea to Samaria and, finally, to "the uttermost part of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

-The church, the body of Christ, "grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work" **(Ephesians 4:16)**.

The Base Project progress report

The CFaN building is a double storey structure on plot number 54618, Block 5 in Gaborone. The plot area is 425m2 with 417.5m2 to be utilized for the building. The main church auditorium is housed on ground floor while the upper floor will be used for Youth and Sunday school activities.

QUALITY CONTROL

We are taking the construction of this building very seriously and our level of commitment to excellence is as thorough as could be, being inspired by the very God we worship - the Chief builder. We won't be skipping any quality control procedures or cutting any corners just to get a building. I have made a commitment to be on the ground to make sure that this structure will reflect CFaN's heart of worship to her God.

IMPLEMENTATION

The actual construction of the church building started early June 2021 and is progressing well. The implementation of the project is being done in phases to manage the accumulation and flow of funds.



The Lord has been faithful thus far as I am glad to report that the foundations and Surface bed/ ground floor slab are 100% done.

The other phases to follow are very dependent on us continuing to trust God so we give generously to this work. Provisional phasing is as follows:
